Medical Student Education

COVID-19 continued to affect the Family Medicine rural preceptorship for third-year medical students.

- Five rotation sites lost
- Student housing lost at some sites due to traveling staff
- Students could no longer perform home visits
- Student were required to be fitted for N95 masks
- Family Medicine Clerkship was shortened to six weeks when rotations resumed in June 2020
- Rotations went back to eight weeks for the 2021-2022 academic year starting on April 5, 2021
- The traditional orientation day adjusted for COVID procautions. Student were provided care packages and distanced in two separate rooms.
- Clinic sites ask for proof of vaccination for visiting students.

Sports Medicine Fellowship

This Primary Care Sports Medicine (PCSM) fellowship is a twelve-month program sponsored by the University of Nebraska Medical Center Department of Family Medicine.

The fellowship was accredited by the ACGME in October 2021. The program accepts applicants who have completed residency training in Family Medicine, Emergency Medicine, Internal Medicine, Pediatrics, Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation, and Med/Peds.

Fellowship faculty included providers from Family Medicine, Emergency Medicine, Pediatrics, Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation, Radiology, and Orthopedics.




Dr. Michael Hall was the first fellow to join the program in July 2022.

- Nebraska AHEC Program submitted another grant application to Health Resources & Service Administration (HRSA) for another five-years of continued funding. Funding is anticipated.
- The Nebraska AHEC Scholars Program, a twoyear supplemental program for health profession students interested in working in rural and underserved areas of Nebraska, graduated 64 AHEC Scholars from the 2020 – 2022 cohort. AHEC Scholars gain access to exclusive workshops, potential employers, community leaders, and national and state resources on the latest health topics.







Department Awards and Accolades

UNMC New Investigator Award: Liliana Bronner

The New Investigator Award is given to outstanding UNMC scientists who, in the past two years, have secured their first funding from the National Institutes of Health, the Department of Defense or other national sources. New Investigator Award recipients also need to demonstrate scholarly activity, such as publishing their research and/or presenting their findings at national conventions.

Women's Center of Advancement Outstanding Woman Honoree: Andrea Jones, MD

This award is given annually to 10 outstanding women in Omaha whose actions have helped others stay safe and grow strong.
