- Do I qualify? Complete an online assessment to see if you qualify for any type of assistance through Health and Human Services
- Note: You may be asked to document your eligibility for Federal Work Study (FWS)
 and/or \$0 EFC status. You can document FWS eligibility by taking a screenshot of your
 financial aid award screen in MyRecords or document your EFC by downloading your
 Student Aid Report (SAR). Please follow these instructions for downloading your SAR.

• Emergency Broadband Benefit

- The <u>Affordable Connectivity Program</u> will provide a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on Tribal lands. Qualifications include:
 - Income level at or below 200% of the poverty guideline
 - Receive certain government benefits (SNAP, WIC, Medicaid, Free or reduced lunches)
 - Qualify through a child or dependent
