

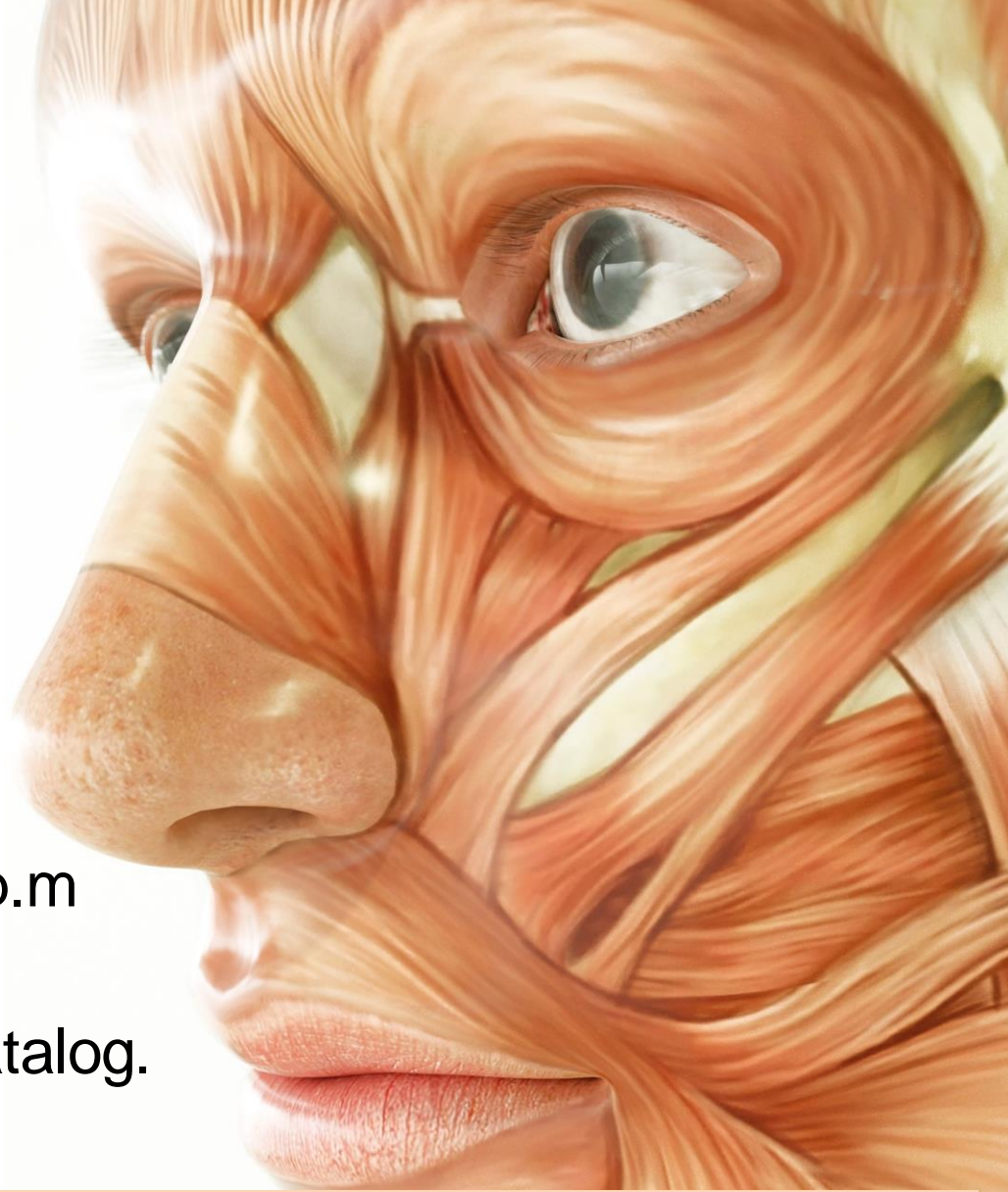



Abstract

A retrospective cohort study of 2,218 patients with deep vein thrombosis or pulmonary embolism during a 25-year period from 1966-1990 in Minnesota showed an annual incidence of venous thromboembolism of 117 per 100,000 (deep vein thrombosis, 48 per 100,000; pulmonary embolism, 69 per 100,000). Higher rates were found in males than females (130 vs 110 per 100,000, respectively) after adjusting for age. Early diagnosis and appropriate treatment of DVT and PE have been shown to significantly reduce mortality and morbidity. Risk factors for venous thromboembolism include alterations in blood flow (surgery, injury or long-distance air travel, pregnancy, obesity), hypercoagulability (factor V Leiden mutation, prothrombin mutation, protein C deficiency, protein S deficiency, antithrombin deficiency, hyperhomocysteinemia, antiphospholipid syndrome, nephrotic syndrome, paroxysmal nocturnal hemoglobinuria) and vessel wall abnormalities. Eighty percent of deep venous thrombosis resolves spontaneously and less than 15% embolize to pulmonary arteries.





In only five short years after receiving his MD, Cutter became the Dean of the unified College of Medicine in 1915. Cutter was responsible for finalizing the transfer of basic sciences faculty to Omaha and filling the new North Laboratory (Poynter Hall). Dean Cutter really looked forward to the future of academic and clinical medicine. He was responsible for requesting and receiving the funds from the state legislature to build University Hospital (1917), South Laboratory (Bennett Hall) (1919), and School of Nursing building (1923). A local paper declared that Cutter was responsible for the College of Medicine growing from a "small, little known institution into a large, modern collegee of the very highest standing; the hospital, in connection with school, has become a model studied by planners and builders . . . from all over the country." Cutter also led the College through World War I. Eighty faculty members and students served near and far during the war. The Board of Regents grants Cutter leaves of absence to serving as a Captain in the Medical Corps. Fore-shadowing his role in the war, as an undergraduate student at UNL, Cutter had served in the Cadet Corps under John J. "Black Jack" Pershing.

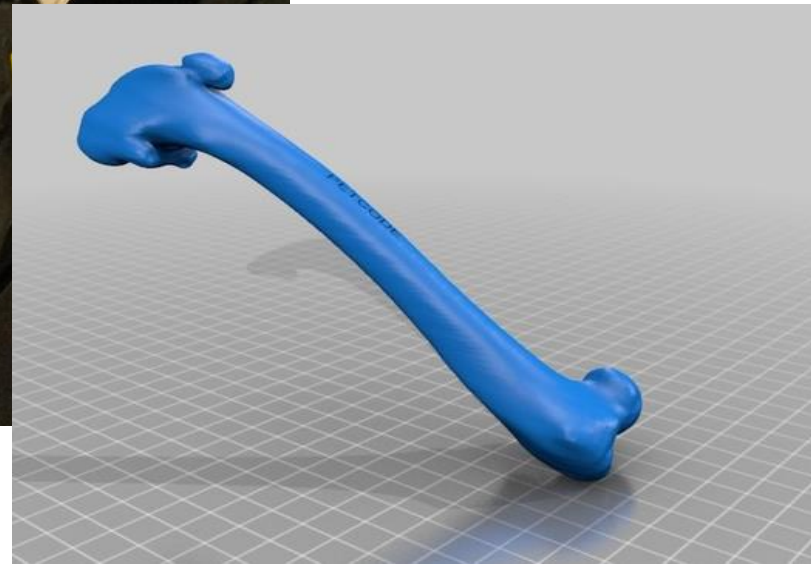
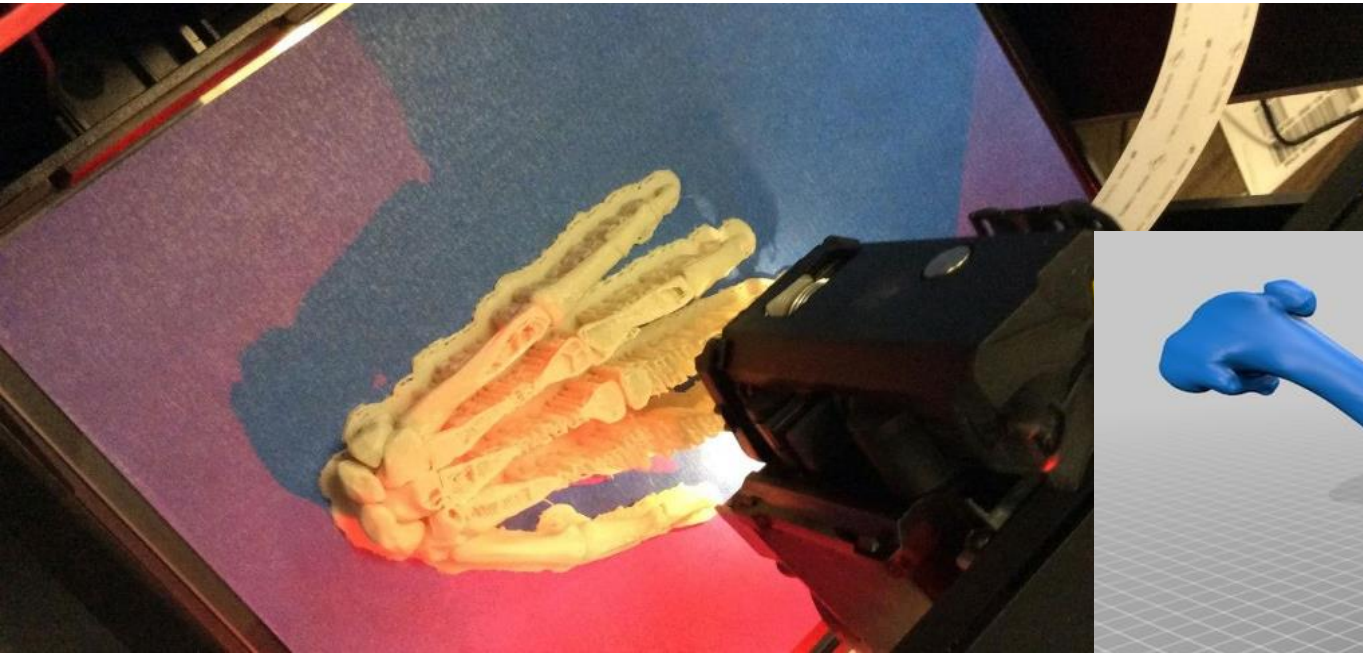
